Treasure Valley Down Syndrome Association is dedicated to preserving the privacy of all personal information about visitors to this site.

This website is owned and operated by the Treasure Valley Down Syndrome Association (hereinafter "TVDSA"). When you participate in a TVDSA event, donate to the organization, sign up for the mailing list or request information about our services, TVDSA will ask for your name, address, e-mail address and telephone number. We may also request some demographic information such as gender, age of the individual with Down syndrome, ethnicity and information about your family. We will use your contact information only to provide the information requested, and to correspond with you via mail and/or email if you are interested. If you supply TVDSA with your postal address online, you may receive periodic mailings from us with information on upcoming events. If you do not wish to receive mail, please do not enter your address information. TVDSA is concerned about preserving the privacy of all personal information about visitors to this site. Please be assured that TVDSA does not share or sell any information that you give us.

Cookies

We may use "cookies" on some pages of our website to help us serve you better each time you return. A cookie is a small text file which is sent by a website, accepted by a web browser and then placed on your hard drive. The data collected from these cookies helps us to analyze browsing patterns of our visitors in order to improve the content and design of our website. The information collected from these cookies is for the exclusive use of TVDSA and will not be shared with other vendors. Log Files

An IP address is a number that is automatically assigned to your computer whenever you are surfing on the Web. Web servers automatically will identify a computer by its IP address. We use IP addresses to analyze trends, administer the site, track users' movement and gather broad demographic information for aggregate use. IP addresses are not linked to personally identifiable information.

Notification of Changes

Users will have a choice as to whether or not we use their information in this different manner.
