Joe Explains: How To Get Pretty Girls to Talk to You (his favorite occupation)

It was a bitter cold February day with sleet, snow and hail coming down in buckets. What could I do to entertain my teenage son on my weekend visit? "Joe," I said cheerfully, "We're aoing to a place with lots of boys and girls." I drove him to the Poughkeepsie Galleria. As a handsome eiahteen vear old. Joe doesn't let Down syndrome or developmental disabilities hold him back. He knows exactly how to find and get a pretty girl to talk to him. Once inside the mall, Joe scanned the stores and into tugged me а clothing store. There were big pictures of teens wearing jeans and t-shirts, mood lighting and inviting music. There

was a pretty Asian girl folding clothes at a display. Joe smiled at her. He turned to me and tapped my lips with his index finger, nodding with a touch of impatience. He was clearly telegraphing, "come on, Mom, you know what to do." I did. Since Joe is non-verbal and can only answer Yes or questions via eye gaze (a direct gaze for Yes, looking down for No), we often play Twenty Questions to find out exactly what he wants me to say when he meets a pretty girl.

So, I turned to the pretty Asian girl. "Hi, could I ask your first name?" "Asia," she answered, smiling. "Hi Asia, this is my son, Joe. He would like you to know that he's eighteen, a very cool guy, and he thinks you are very

pretty." Asia's response was typical, but gratifying: she turned to my son with a big smile and said. "Oh! Thanks Joe, I'm glad to meet you. That's a very nice thing to say to me."

Joe nodded, grinning from ear to ear. We thanked Asia and went on our way. A few minutes later, Joe let me buy him an educational toy at Barnes and Noble - solely in order to meet and converse with the beautiful young cashier. Her name was Katie. Cheeseburgers and fries at a diner (with pretty waitresses) rounded out the afternoon. When I brought Joe back to his group home, he was still smiling. It had been a very good day.
