When Matthew was 2 years old Melody read about the NDSS "Buddy Walk" which was taking place across the United States to increase awareness about Down syndrome. She was anxious to participate but soon found that Idaho was only 1 of 2 states that did not yet have an organized Buddy Walk. Another 2 years went by without any Buddy Walks taking place in Idaho. When Matthew was 5 years old Melody decided to organize the first Idaho walk. The Buddy Walk in Boise has grown from 138 participants the first year to over 1400 in 2011. On Sat., Oct. 13, 2012 our 10th annual Buddy Walk will take place.

The Boise Buddy Walk is the major fundraiser for TVDSA and has allowed TVDSA to produce comprehensive informational packets for new parents, sponsor educational workshops and videos, offer conference scholarships, contribute to an all-abilities playground for our children, support parent groups, and much more.


From the TVDSA Lending Library
