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### **History of the NDSS Buddy Walk**

The Buddy Walk® program was established in 1995 by the National Down Syndrome Society (NDSS) to promote acceptance and inclusion of people with Down syndrome and to celebrate Down Syndrome Awareness Month in October. The name Buddy Walk® promotes inclusion between friends of every ability. It started with only 17 walks during the inaugural year with Chris Burke leading the flagship New York City Buddy Walk. Today, there are over 250 walks ground the world!

The Buddy Walk has three primary goals:

- 1. To promote acceptance and inclusion of people with Down syndrome. ANYONE who wants to support acceptance and inclusion of people with Down syndrome can participate in the Buddy Walk.
- 2. To raise funds for local programs and services and national advocacy efforts. All of the Buddy Walks combined, raise more than \$10 million to benefit local programs and services as well as national and advocacy initiatives each year.
- 3. To enhance the position of the Down syndrome community, enabling us to positively influence local and national policy and practices.

The Buddy Walk program is supported at the national level by the National Down Syndrome Society (NDSS). Local Buddy Walk events are organized by NDSS Affiliates, parent support groups, schools, and other interested organizations and individuals. Most Buddy Walk events take place from September through November, to recognize Down Syndrome Awareness Month in October.

The Buddy Walk was not initially a fundraising venue. That was not added until 1999. Currently, 7% of the proceeds earned at each Buddy Walk goes towards NDSS for national and advocacy initiatives and the remaining stays at the local level. Also in 1999, NDSS introduced the Time Square Video to bring attention to the Buddy Walk program and raise acceptance of individuals with Down syndrome. Families from across the nation submit the pictures each year.

## History of the Buddy Walk (continued from page 3)

In 2001, the Buddy Walk logo – the blue and yellow graphic with a family holding hands was adopted. The logo was trademarked by NDSS in 2003. In 2002, John C. McGinley joined NDSS as a National Buddy Walk Spokesman. He recently became the NDSS Ambassador in the My Great Story Campaign. The following year, 2003, was the first Treasure Valley Down Syndrome Association Buddy Walk which had 139 walkers participate.

The Buddy Walk has grown quickly. In 2014, the Buddy Walk® had a record breaking year with more than 315,000 participants raising nearly \$13 million dollars in more than 250 events across the country and around the world.

The first Buddy Walk held on a military base in a combat zone took place at Camp Phoenix in Kabul, Afghanistan in 2009.

TVDSA will have some wonderful raffle baskets to win this year.


