




7th Annual All-Ability Easter Egg Hunt





U.S. Supreme Court Rules on Special Education Case

In a unanimous 8-0 decision issued Wednesday, March 22nd, the U.S. Supreme Court ruled that schools must provide more than a "merely more than de Minimis" education program to students with disabilities. Sending the case back to the 10th circuit, the Court did not define that standard but in the ruling stated, ""For children with disabilities, receiving instruction that aims so low would be tantamount to 'sitting idly ... awaiting the time when they were old enough to 'drop out.' The IDEA demands more. It requires an educational program reasonably calculated to enable a child to make progress appropriate in light of the child's circumstances."

Idaho Legislative Update

Idaho House Bill 41-ABLE legislation (sponsored by Senator Burgoyne and Representative Troy) was signed by Governor Otter March 20th! ABLE Technical Assistance and Financial Literacy education kicks off at the SILC July 1st.

Though Idaho has not implemented its own ABLE account program, the new law does provide technical assistance to Idahoans interested in starting ABLE accounts in other states. Idahoans who became disabled before age 26 can now be secure in the knowledge that they can save in ABLE accounts for qualified expenses, including employment supports, education, assistive technology, and more.
