Thank You to Two Excellent TVDSA Board Members!



Paul Auger, father of two children, Baylee (17) and Trevor (8), joined the TVDSA Board of Directors in June of 2010, after moving here from Texas in 2008. During the seven years he served on the board, he has worn many hats and helped with many projects, activities, and events. His first hat was as the Programs Chair. During his one year in this position he established the Cool Club social group for teenagers, researched and established the Dad's Appreciating Down Syndrome (D.A.D.S.) chapter to offer support to the fathers in the Treasure Valley, and he organized three mini-workshops for parents, He, with Kristie Yerger leading the Lil' Buddies at the time, organized the first TVDSA All Ability Easter Egg Hunt held in Eagle that year. The All Ability Easter Egg Hunt continues as an annual event.

In June of 2011, with a big change in the board of directors' membership, Paul took the leadership role of President. He served a two year term. He is always all business. Many of the common procedures that many before him had done became official oard Policies, to streamline future endeavors by TVDSA. One of those policies was the annual scholarship supporting TVDSA members financially in gathering information at local and national conferences and/or workshops and for Self-Advocates to attend college courses.

After serving as President, he served as the Marketing Chair from 2013-14 because that was where the need was. While Marketing Chair, and with help from creative business friends, he helped design new TVDSA Awareness materials, and gave the Buddy Walk poster and postcards a new look. During the end of his year term, he and his wife, Celena, took on the leadership role to bring the iCan Bike Camp to the Treasure Valley, serving ALL individuals with disabilities and teaching them the valuable skill of riding a traditional two-wheel bike.

His last hat was as both Board Secretary & Membership Chair, from 2014-2017. During this time, he also continued his love of the iCan Bike Camp and would take a week of his vacation from work to dedicate to the camp three years in a row. A passion, a love, and the satisfaction of seeing 40 bikers each year, smile, grow confident, and succeed. Although Paul has stepped away from the board, he has committed to helping (probably leading) if the board chooses to bring the iCan Bike Camp back in the future. In 2015, he and Celena also took on the lead on the ATV Raffle which with help from many individuals selling tickets raised over \$10,000 for TVDSA that year. It was however too much for the couple to lead simultaneously with the bike camp and passed the reins for future raffles.

These are only the highlights – if you have ever met Paul, he is a pleasant man to speak with, a hard, detailed worker, and a dedicated family man. He stepped away from TVDSA to help prepare his daughter, Baylee, prepare for adulthood, and for the next chapter of her life, which includes college. The board would like to thank Paul for his time and dedication. Good luck to you!



Reme Echevarria is a busy mother of two girls: Isabella (8) and Abigail (Abi) (6). Reme took over the Mom's Night Out! Coordinator in July 2015 and she made it boom! She takes this job as seriously as she does her other two (paying) jobs! She makes an effort to rotate areas, food preferences, and activities, so all moms can find one (or more) activities through the year that may interest them, and celebrate the adventure all moms of individuals with Down syndrome share. She makes an effort to make sure each mom feels appreciated and deserving of a night off (although she herself is still working!) Out of all of the active TVDSA social groups, Mom's Night Out! consistently has the highest average turn out. This is because Reme takes the time to reach out to the active members and makes it a point to invite new moms to each meeting.

Reme stepped up when there was need and helped with the Buddy Walk Committee in 2015. She has continued her support as a crucial contributor to the success of the annual raffle held during the Buddy Walk ever since.

Reme was recruited as a board member in January 2016 and served as Co–Fundraising chair. She immediately took on the Disneyland Raffle project, raising over \$10,000 for TVDSA when it was done (a short seven months later). Reme has also organized the first TVDSA Paint Nite in March 2017 and now the second Paint Nite this month (it's not too late to join the fun!) Reme added to her busy life juggling responsibilities, the Communications Committee in the middle of last year. The Communications Committee reviews ALL printed materials, social media, and emails representing TVDSA (which there are a lot!) Despite stepping down as a board member, she continues to raise funds for TVDSA, getting TVDSA enrolled in the Macy's Charity Challenge also going on this month.

Reme needs to focus on her family right now, though she won't give up her Mom's Night Out! and Communications Committee responsibilities. AND you may notice she loves her Paint Nites! The board would like to thank you, Reme, for your love of TVDSA. We appreciate you!




