DSDIA is Now Law

TVDSA is proud to announce that through our partnership with Idaho Down Syndrome Council (IDSC), Bill 1270 (DSDIA) was signed into Idaho law on March 21, World Down Syndrome Day. The law takes effect July 1, 2022. The DSDIA passage is the culmination of two years work on the part of IDSC, and we are proud to be a part of that.

DSDIA ensures parents receive up-to-date, fact-based information regarding Down syndrome at the time of diagnosis. This is a crucial step to a wider goal of better education of Idaho healthcare providers regarding the proper delivery of diagnosis information for a positive and uplifting result.

IDSC is a group that was formed with the purpose of unifying resources and raising Down syndrome awareness across the entire state of Idaho. IDSC founding members include TVDSA as well as our friends at Eastern Idaho Down Syndrome Family Connect (EIDS) and Down Syndrome Connections Northwest (DS Connections).

Member Directory Coming

There is currently a project in work to create a TVDSA Member Directory. This will be an *opt-in* directory where current members will give their consent for information to be shared.

TVDSA member and former Board President, Kristie Oakes, will develop a directory for current TVDSA members to ensure they have access to one another.

Friendship is very important to everyone, and peers are the best way to form lasting relationships. By giving access to their contact information, along with the age of the individual(s) with Down syndrome to our current members, we can provide them with the information necessary to achieve these friendships.

The IEP meeting: An overview understood.org

El propósito de una reunión del IEP es discutir, desarrollar y revisar el IEP de un estudiante.

Las escuelas están obligadas a organizar una reunión del IEP anualmente para revisar el progreso del estudiante.

Sin embargo, los padres pueden solicitar una reunión del IEP en cualquier momento para tratar asuntos específicos:

La reunión del IEP es una de las partes más importantes del proceso de educación especial. En esta reunión, el personal de la escuela y los padres se reúnen para discutir, desarrollar y revisar el IEP del estudiante. Se aseguran de que el IEP satisfaga sus necesidades.

Existen reglas para las reuniones del IEP sobre quiénes pueden participar y qué sucede en ellas. La mejor manera de entender estas reglas es recordar el propósito de la reunión. Se trata de un esfuerzo conjunto entre la escuela y los padres para planificar la educación especial de un estudiante.

The purpose of an IEP meeting is to discuss, develop, and review a student's IEP.

Schools are required to hold an annual IEP meeting each year to look at a student's progress.

However, parents can request an IEP meeting at any time for specific issues.

The IEP meeting is one of the most important parts of the special education process. In this meeting, school staff and parents come together to discuss, develop, and review a student's IEP. They make sure the IEP meets the student's needs.

There are rules for IEP meetings. They cover who must attend and what happens. The best way to understand these rules is to remember the goal of the meeting. The school and parents are working together to plan a student's special education experience at school.
